

Kit List

The following are the basic requirements for kit for the forthcoming camp, any additional items needs for specific activities will be advised accordingly. Please note that uniform shirts and neckers will be worn when travelling to and from camp. Please name all personal kit/clothing (you would be surprised just what turns up when we unload the minibus sometimes).

Wire coat hanger for uniform	Warm sweater or fleece
Rucksack /holdall / kit bag	Long sleeved shirts – 2
Sleeping bag	Trousers (NOT JEANS)
Roll mat	Change of underclothes
Blanket (optional if season sleeping bag is 3 / 4 season, but still useful for sitting around the campfire with)	Socks 3 pairs
Waterproof coat	Personal first aid kit
Overtrousers (if you have them)	Torch with spare batteries
Long johns or tracksuit trousers (it is likely to be cold)	Teddy!
Waterproof coat	Handkerchiefs/tissues
Over trousers (if you have them)	Plastic bags for dirty clothes
Pyjamas	Hat and gloves (scarf or buff optional)
Personal wash kit ¹	Pair of sturdy boots – we will be using knife and axe, as well as cooking on open fires ²
Towel	Penknife (to be used under supervision) ³
Tea towel (preferably an old one)	
Plate/bowl/mug and cutlery	

Please remember that thinner layers are more effective than 1 thick one, so if you feel the cold do bring a few extra tops and thick socks. We will be carrying out the full planned programme, within reason, whatever the weather. It is better to have a few too many clothes at this time of year rather than too few – nobody likes being cold and wet.

Note kit will be travelling to camp in the trailer, so please have everything securely packed with no loose stuff hanging outside, you will need to carry your bag when we reach the site, so try and pack everything in one

If you have any questions regarding kit selection, or are not sure whether to spend a fortune on new items – please speak to any of the leader team, we may be able to help (we do can sometimes loan boots, sleeping mats etc, or offer advice on any kit purchase)

1. Please note : Aerosols of any kind are not permitted at camp
2. We do have a small selection of suitable boots in sizes 4/5/6/7 that may be borrowed for this weekend if you do not have, please speak to Alan or Phil if you think you need a pair – first come first served!
3. Penknives and scouts – We believe the use of a penknife is a necessity for a scout at camp, in the right circumstances. Scouts will need to pass the safety & use requirements before use (even if done on a previous occasion) – this will be covered at the start of camp. Any penknife taken **must** travel with the kit to and from camp, and must not be taken off site. Knives are never worn with Scout uniform whilst travelling.
